CANDLELIGHT VIGIL WILL HONOR SIDS VICTIMS

Chairman Cox, Parents, Health Officials to Raise Awareness of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome

WHAT: Parents and County Officials will hold a candlelight vigil to honor children who have

died from Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) and raise public awareness of ways

to decrease the risk. Parents of children who died from SIDS will speak about their

tragic loss.

WHY: Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) is the sudden, unexpected death of an

apparently healthy infant under one year of age that remains unexplained after

thorough review of the death. SIDS claims the lives of more than 2,100 babies

nationwide each year. There were 31 SIDS cases in San Diego County in 2007.

SIDS occurs in all socio-economic, racial and ethnic groups. At this time there is no

known way to prevent SIDS in all cases, but there are steps parents and caregivers

can take to reduce the risk of sudden infant death.
