INFLUENZA UPDATE – JAN. 7, 2004

The San Diego County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) reports additional influenza-associated deaths, and a decreased percentage of people with influenza-like symptoms at local emergency departments.

To date there have been 17 influenza-associated deaths, ranging in age from 16 to 98 years of age. The most recent reports include an 89-year-old woman, 94-year-old woman, and 98-year-old woman. Results are still pending on the cases of a 13-year-old girl and a 15-year-old boy, to determine if their deaths are associated with influenza.

For the week of Dec. 28 to Jan. 3, hospital emergency departments surveyed by HHSA reported that 16 percent of patients came in with influenza-like illnesses. This is down from 23 percent for the previous week's reporting period (Dec. 21 – Dec. 27). Percentages for each hospital are not available.

Since schools were out of session for the holidays, the percentage of students who were absent from school for any reason was not tracked for this period.

San Diego County remains at Level II in the *County Health Services Capacity Task Force Plan*, which means that HHSA and hospital partners, continue to monitor the situation carefully. According to Nancy Bowen, San Diego County Public Health Officer, the local health care system is handling the volume of patients due to influenza-associated illness.
