COUNTY ENCOURAGES AWARENESS OF MENINGOCOCCAL DISEASE Following Death of North County Student, Parents Urged to Get Children Vaccinated

year-old North County student over the weekend.

WHY: The death of a 15-year-old Canyon Crest Academy student of Meningococcal disease is

a cause for concern. The risk of infection is extraordinarily low but parents are urged to

seek vaccination for their children.

Those in close contact with the student have been notified and advised to seek preventive antibiotic treatment. Close contact is defined as living in the same household or sharing oral secretions, such as by kissing or sharing food, drinks, water bottles,

cigarettes, lipstick, etc.

Parents also have been advised to be on alert for symptoms which include: fever, headache, stiff neck and/or rash that does not blanch on pressure.

To reduce the spread of meningococcal disease and other communicable diseases, HHSA recommends not sharing food, drinks, water bottles, lipstick or lip balm, etc. A vaccine is available to prevent some strains of meningococcal disease.
