HEALTHLINK NORTH COUNTY CELEBRATES 10 YEARS OF IMPROVING THE HEALTH OF SCHOOL-AGE CHILDREN

Public/Private Partnership at Work in 25 North County School Districts

WHAT:

HealthLink North County is a school-focused, public/private partnership that has been working to improve health and education outcomes for North County school-aged children for the past decade. The collaborative has been instrumental in various regional and countywide school health initiatives. The award-winning 2005 *School Food* and 2006 *School Fitness Summits* brought hundreds of people together to implement school-based strategies for healthier campuses. Other notable accomplishments include a partnership with the North County Dental Task Force to promote free dental screenings reaching over 1,500 North County children; the development and distribution of "Nutrition to Grow On" garden toolkits to all North County elementary school districts; and support for school-based diabetes screening.

In keeping with the traditional 10-year anniversary gift of aluminum or tin, participants at the event are encouraged to donate canned food items to support North Region's "Little Angels Pantry" which provides food to hungry families with children.
