In interpretation of the numbers in this report, please consider the following points:

- The data provided in this report are considered provisional particularly for the most recent time periods. This is due to:
 - Inherent reporting delays, and
 - Possible inclusion of "suspected" cases that upon further clinical/laboratory/epidemiologic evaluation and verification may be excluded.

In 2008, the following disease was added to Sublist for provider reporting, Title 17, California Code of Regulation (CCR) § 2500:

- Staphylococcus aureus infection (only a case resulting in death or admission to an intensive care unit of a person who has not been hospitalized or had surgery, dialysis, or residency in a long-term care facility in the past year, and did not have an indwelling catheter or percutaneous medical device at the time of culture.

In 2007, the following revisions were made to Sublist for provider reporting, Title 17, CCR § 2500:

- Escherichia coli: shiga toxin producing (STEC) including E. coli 0157 was added.
- Haemophilus influenzae invasive disease was specified to include cases less than 15 years old.
- Lymphogranuloma Venereum was included in reporting of Chlamydial infections.
- Cysticercosis changed to "Cysticercosis or Taeniasis"
