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INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this report is to present, in a single volume, a county specific baseline of data that describe:

Population	Age-Adjusted and Age-Specific Death Rates	Medi-Cal and Medicare Data
Socioeconomic Status	Mortality by Cause of Death	Health Services Utilization
Birth Data	Communicable Disease Data	Health Resources
Infant, Neonatal and Perinatal Deaths	County Health Indicators	

This report is divided into three sections. Section I contains all 180 health and socio-economic indicators for each individual county. Section II contains these same indicators in a manner that facilitates cross-county comparisons. Section III presents the definitions and sources of data used in the development of each indicator. Data presented in this report are not intended to be exhaustive but will strive to present a balance of frequently requested data from various sources at the State and Federal levels. For each indicator, the specific source used in acquiring the data is identified in Section III so that the user can obtain more detailed information if needed. This report contains the most recent point-in-time data for each indicator.

IMPORTANT NOTE

When making cross-county comparisons, it is important to remember that many of the rates presented in this report for smaller counties, as well as those based on a small number of events in larger counties (e.g., infant death rates by race), can fluctuate significantly from year to year. The rates that are based on too few events have an asterisk (*) next to them indicating that the rate is unreliable (relative standard error greater than or equal to 23% of the rate). The symbol "N" denotes that a rate was not calculated for less than 5 events or 1,000 births in accordance with standard statistical procedure. The under reporting certain events (e.g., communicable diseases) can also contribute to county differences in some of these indicators. Therefore, caution should be used when making cross-county comparisons only on the indicators in this report. A more thorough analysis of county differences should include an examination of trend data over several years and the effects of sampling variability (see Joel C. Kleinman, *Statistical Notes for Health Planners, "Mortality"*, Number 3, National Center for Health Statistics, February 1977).

For some indicators, the sum of the county data may not equal the State total due to rounding or the inclusion in the State total of “unknown” county data.

For a correct understanding of the meaning of each indicator, the definitions in Section III should be referenced. For more detailed information concerning a particular indicator, the data source for each indicator listed in Section III should be contacted.

The reliability of the rates presented in this report have been calculated and those that have a relative standard error equal to or greater than 23 percent have been noted by an asterisk (*) and caution should be used in interpreting these rates. The symbol “N” denotes that a rate was not calculated for less than 5 events or less than 1,000 births in smaller counties.

Three-year average rates are calculated with mid-year population.
